




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Non-Technical Managers

But they can never match your tech skills





- I quit my first management job
 - My manager left (the Agile proponent)
 - Politics beat me senseless
 - Re-organized from business to IT
- I went back to being an Architect
 - Coding again, yay!
 - Learned Groovy and Grails
 - Learned NoSOLe as small as your controlling desire; as your dominant aspiration."

In 2010

- I remembered why I left coding
 - I was tired or writing web applications
 - I was working for a guy just like me!
- I still wanted to make the decisions on:
 - What we are building
 - How the culture works

Relativity and Management

- Frames of Reference
 - Are you a threat?
 - Are you helpful?
 - Are you a poor communicator?
- If you can't learn empathy, at least learn how to write stories
 - You did the BA role, correct?
 - Estimate and Prioritize management stories

Networking


- Meet everyone
- Get along with everyone
 - People you don't like
 - People who don't like you
 - People you don't agree with philosophically
 - People with personalities that rub you wrong
 - People who are insanely demanding
 - People you can walk all over (but choose not to)

Building Culture

- You will have to fight for this!
- Culture builds upon itself, you are the architect
- Seed it in the right direction
- Monitor, it will degrade over time

Hire Top Talent

- You will probably have to fight for this right
- Most companies have limited ways to access engineers
- You may want to break them, but don't, change or work the system instead
- Create the environment that attracts top talent first become as small as your controlling desire; as great as your dominant aspiration."

Retain Top Talent

- Once you have great people, keep them
- This requires the right culture, define it!
 - Challenging work
 - Meaningful work
 - Distributed decision making
 - Clearing obstacles
 - Listening to the engineers over managers "You will become as small as your controlling desire; as great as your dominant aspiration."

Do the Dirty Work


- Learn how to fire people nicely
- Deliver constructive feedback
- Confront slackers and egregious, but talented, rule breakers
- Reign in rock stars
- Plan parties and recognition
- Go to everyone's events on your free time

Utilize Politics

- Protect the core ideals of your culture
- Sell benefits to executives
- Explain your culture to 100s of people
- Make sure executives who have benefited from your work understand the need to protect the unique style of your teams
- Keep your promises as your controlling desire; as great as your dominant aspiration."

Build a Culture Where Engineers Manage

- Bring engineers along slowly to management
- Be ok when engineers decide it's not what they want to do
- Make sure they have room to code during their week
- Mentor, ensure they learn about management concepts and practices


What happens when you have organizational power?


- Manage like an Engineer

- The shift from managing doers to managing managers is a large step

2014 - 2015


- Teams and scope continued to grow

- Does being technical still matter when you no longer manage engineers?


